Wish I could say that more often, too. Their abrasive, melodic, angry, sensitive thrash pop reminded me a little of Sebadoh at their grimiest, and even of The Lemonheads in their early punk days, but their real victory is making stodgy, sticky grunge thumping sound sly and hypnotic, and not brattishly petulant.
